WHY WE PRAY BEFORE THE BLESSED SACRAMENT—JOHN A. KANE



Prayers of Healing & Reparation

Nov 30

The peace of soul that is ours in our moments of adoration is a blissful exaltation above the turmoil of time, an anticipa-tion of the eternal peace of Heaven. Our union with the eucharistic worshipers, the myriad hosts of angels that sur-round the tabernacle, adoring in Heaven as they gaze forever on His soulstirring divinity, humbly prostrate before Him in His sacramental lowliness as He hides the beauty that would overwhelm us — what is this but paradise on earth?

Thus raised above the visible, we can forego its claims and honor Christ for His own dear sake. We can compensate for the irreverences of those who believe, but do not realize, the mystery of His Real Presence, and for the profanations of those who absolutely deny it. If we love Christ, we will gladly spend ourselves trying to repair the dishonor which He so pa-tiently endures in the sacrament of His love. The conscious recognition of what He suffers will help us to increase our love of Him.

Our reparation does not remove the injuries, nor do we ab-solve the offenders by offering our love as compensation for their want of love. But heart speaking to heart in understand-ing sympathy gives to the heart's desires an additional value. Only too tragically verified, in our day, are the words of the evangelist: "He came unto His own, and His own received Him not." In the anguish of His rejection by so many for whom He died, Christ turns to souls who love the tranquillity, the eternal calm, of His eucharistic humiliation. As they tell Him of their joy just to be near Him; as they beseech Him for greater grace to communicate more worthily; as they pour out their love for Him — love ever intensifying with the fre-quency of their Holy Communions — as they invite the an-gels around the tabernacle to join in their act of thanksgiving for this divinely gracious gift, their love and their gratitude will touch His Sacred Heart, and will make amends for the heartless unconcern, the chilling disregard, of His thoughtless creatures.

When the world is cold to Christ, and questions with su-perficial, destructive criticism the truth of His sacramental presence, while He continues to dwell with infinite patience in a desert of forgetfulness, where ingratitude so abounds, and to bless those who outrage Him, our loving reparation may be best appraised by the withering disappointment that the sac-ramental Savior daily experiences in those who seem to de -light in driving Him, their God, far from them.

Maintaining A Prayerful Environment

The General Instructions of the Roman Missal (GIRM):

147 of the official 'how to celebrate Holy Mass' states that the people wait during the Preparation of the Gifts for the Priest to complete his invitation: Pray Brethren that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the Almighty Father," before they stand and then say "May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands...." This also is spelled out in our St. Joseph Pew Sunday Missal on P.21 that we Stand only after the Priests says the whole invitation.

Prayerful Pause of 30 full seconds after the 1st and 2nd Reading: The Lectionary Rubrics (Instructions) state: "A period of silence is observed after the reading." At the Abbey in Mission this is for 2 minutes. Here, in parish life, it will be a full 30 seconds (time is an "Our Father). (At the Archbishop's Pastoral Visit at Assumption, Port Coquitlam, he was pleased with this practice and encouraged it)


Kids today are growing up with technology.

Request for Clothing & Non-Perishable Food

The Order of Malta is organizing Blue Drop Boxes in the back of the parish vestibule for the "Door is Open" Catholic charity.

The Door is Open is a drop-in ministry that provides food, clothing, counselling, shelter services, referrals, and a warm, safe environment in the heart of Vancouver's Downtown Eastside, a neighbourhood recognized for the highest concentration of the poorest urban population in the whole of Canada. It feeds up to 250 people everyday of the year. Right now, more people than usual need their assistance to survive and are counting on the Door is Open for their daily meals. At this time, they cannot allow volunteers to help them so they have to prepare the food themselves, mostly sandwiches.

They need non-perishable foods, such as canned tuna, pasta, pasta sauce, etc... You can also make a cash donation if you cannot go shopping. Seasonal, clean clothing is very welcome, especially socks, tshirts, warm jackets, sweaters, hoodies.

Most of us are sitting snug at home, with lots of food, warm and comfortable, we are lucky compare to others. Charity begins at home, this Vancouver.

If you have any reasonably worn clothing that can be reused and nonperishable food you can drop them in the blue boxes that should be available on:




Each light bulb on the tree can be purchased for \$5.00
