2ND SUNDAY OF ADVENT READINGS

Today's gospel deals with the Baptist, that herald of an extraordinary event. The evangelist reports John's cry raised in the desert. He describes his mission to us: to prepare the way, to make straight the road. After a long silence during which there have been no more signs or prophets. God speaks anew. The echo of his voice rumbles across the solitudes announcing a decisive turning point in the history of the world. In an ultimate intervention which fulfils and overflows the ancient hopes, God will come.

But how? Will he show his presence like a meteor leaving a fiery trail across the lower reaches of the atmosphere before pursuing its course through the starry night? Will we only catch a glimpse, in the space of a flash of lightning, and then fall once again into the darkness which covers the world? No, for this Word which erupts into time changes all human history: "All flesh shall see the salvation of God." But to see him we must first die to ourselves in conversion. That is John's message.

It is in the midst of the discordant voices of history that God makes himself heard. By its life of justice, the community of believers ceaselessly sounds forth the invitation of humanity's new exodus.

CHANGE IN HEALTH MEASURES

As of the 1st of December 2021 there are new Health Measures from the Provincial Health Officer for Religious Ceremonies.

• A requirement that participants attending worship services, including choirs, must wear a face covering during worship services, including as participants come in to the place of worship and when they leave, until outside. Participants will be able to remove the face covering when consuming food or drink to allowed to speak without a mask, subject to distancing requirements or barrier to prevent transmission.

WHY WE PRAY BEFORE THE BLESSED SACRAMENT—JOHN A. KANE

Love in the Sacrament

God is always lavish of His love. To enhance our appreciation of His goodness, and therefore add to our happiness, He adorns His gifts. The natural world demonstrates this truth. The gorgeous beauty of the landscape; the golden glory of the rising and setting sun; the colors, which only the Divine Artist could blend, of the rose, the lily, and the violet; the human body with its admirable grace of movement; the at-

tractiveness of the human countenance; the inestimable pleasure of true, loyal friendship — these, which are not necessary for existence, but which so embellish and heighten the enjoyment of life, since they are its distinctive charm, all testify to the magna-nimity and tenderness of God's love.

The same truth is applicable in the institution of the Blessed Sacrament. Christ, in this prodigy of divine ingenuity, besides being the food of the soul, and the pledge of eternal life, is also our companion in all the hardships of earth. The joy of His loving, silent, yet consciously felt, affectionate companion-ship — the harbinger of our intimate, perfect, eternal union with Him — is a superadded blessing, as if this were the only reason for this overflow of divine love.

O eucharistic God, deepen our supernatural conscious-ness of Thy infinite generosity. Consume in us all that is worldly. Purify wholly our interior and quicken our higher faculties, so that we may better appreciate this supreme expression of Thy love for us. Kindle in our hearts a love that will meet the advances of Thy love and associate us now and forever with Thy deepest source of life.

Maintaining A Prayerful Environment

The General Instructions of the Roman Missal (GIRM):

147 of the official 'how to celebrate Holy Mass' states that the people wait during the Preparation of the Gifts for the Priest to complete his invitation: Pray Brethren that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the Almighty Father," before they stand and then say "May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands...." This also is spelled out in our St. Joseph Pew Sunday Missal on P.21 that we Stand only after the Priests says the whole invitation.

Prayerful Pause of 30 full seconds after the 1st and 2nd Reading: The Lectionary Rubrics (Instructions) state: "A period of silence is observed after the reading." At the Abbey in Mission this is for 2 minutes. Here, in parish life, it will be a full 30 seconds (time is an "Our Father). (At the Archbishop's Pastoral Visit at Assumption, Port Coquitlam, he was pleased with this practice and encouraged it)

REQUEST FOR CLOTHING & NON-PERISHABLE FOOD

The Order of Malta is organizing Blue Drop Boxes in the back of the parish vestibule for the "Door is Open" Catholic charity.

The Door is Open is a drop-in ministry that provides food, clothing, counselling, shelter services, referrals, and a warm, safe environment in the heart of Vancouver's Downtown Eastside, a neighbourhood recognized for the highest concentration of the poorest urban population in the whole of Canada. It feeds up to 250 people everyday of the year. Right now, more people than usual need their assistance to survive and are counting on the Door is Open for their daily meals. At this time, they cannot allow volunteers to help them so they have to prepare the food themselves, mostly sandwiches.

They need non-perishable foods, such as canned tuna, pasta, pasta sauce, etc... You can also make a cash donation if you cannot go shopping. Seasonal, clean clothing is very welcome, especially socks, t-shirts, warm jackets, sweaters, hoodies.

Most of us are sitting snug at home, with lots of food, warm and comfortable, we are lucky compare to others. Charity begins at home, this Vancouver.

If you have any reasonably worn clothing that can be reused and nonperishable food you can drop them in the blue boxes that should be available on:

10—12 December 2021

Please ensure that any donations are placed in the Blue Box Provided and only on the days provided above, otherwise they will be discarded.
