TWENTY-FOURTH SUNDAY READING 11TH SEPTEMBER 2022

Three times in this Sunday's gospel we witness the same outburst of joy on the part of someone who has found what was lost: the shepherd his sheep, the woman her silver piece, the father his son. This joy strands in sharp contrast to the dour recriminations of the scribes and Pharisees who see Jesus welcoming sinners and eating with them.

At the time Luke's gospel was written some were indignant at the rejoicing which accompanied the entry of the Gentiles into the household of the Church,. Some, like the older brother, balked at crossing the threshold of a house open to sinners. The book of Acts, also written by Luke, confirms this.

The fifteenth chapter of Luke reminds us that ostracism and intolerance, even when motivated by unquestionable fervour, are contrary to the gospel.

FATHER JOSEPH SELINGER, O.P. ORDINATION

Fr. Joseph Selinger OP, from Our Lady of Assumption parish, Port Coquitlam, was ordained for the Dominican Western Province (Oakland CA) by Bishop Robert Barron on:

June 24th 2022 and is assigned to their Dominican Parish in Portland (Holy Rosary). Fr. Chrysostom Mijinke OP, also from Vancouver, ordained in 2021 is assigned to their Dominican Parish in Seattle (Blessed Sacrament).

Fr. Joseph's brief vocation story:

My time in Vancouver and Port Coquitlam laid the foundation for my faith and priesthood. I benefited from the deep faith life present at Our Lady of the Assumption Parish in Port Coquitlam and throughout the Archdiocese. It was here, in the Archdiocese of Vancouver, that I first encountered Jesus Christ and began a friendship with Him that led me to the priest-

My story is a story of pure grace. I was heading like many people my age after confirmation—away form the Church. However, out of the blue, God intervened with his grace and taught me that my happiness can only be found in God and what leads to Him. I know that it was a divine light because it did not come from any inspiring person, youth event, or anything else. I do not know where this light came into me or how it entered me. One day it hit me without warning and my life was transformed.

Only God can act on the soul in this way. Normally, we are influenced by something we see and hear. We are moved through our relationship to the world and other people. I was not moved in this normal way—my inspiration clearly did not come from this world and was not occasioned by anything proportionate to the transformation that was brought about

God is more intimately present to the soul than we are present to ourselves. It is a mark of the divine presence that he enters our lives in a way so intimate and deep, that we cannot fathom how it occurs. The advent of the Jesus Christ, the Word of God, in the soul occurs in a mysterious manner, just as His incarnation in the womb of the Blessed Virgin Mary was mysterious. God enters the soul as He enters the world—in a way not comprehensible to our weak understanding. He departs the soul as He departed this earth, ascending into heaven, in a way we do not know how and to a place that we cannot comprehend this side of the mortal veil.

However, just as His earthly ministry, beginning with His nativity and ending with His accension, left the world forever transformed, so too does His advent in the soul transform it before He leaves the soul in a mysterious manner. My life was transformed by the sudden advent of Christ which left me completely changed before his departure. Even though Christ departs the Christian soul, His ministry to souls continues through His repeated visits to us. Christ does not just make one advent to us but continually comes and departs, each time leaving us transformed. This is especially true in our reception of Jesus—body, blood, soul and divinity—in our reception of the Eucharist.

I also was fortunate to encounter priests that took their priestly identity seriously and provided a positive image of the priesthood as a joy-filled life of fatherly service to the People of God.

I feel indebted to the people of the Archdiocese of Vancouver for their kind support and witness to Our Lord Jesus Christ.





HER MAJESTY QUEEN ELIZABETH II

QUEEN OF CANADA

QUEEN ELIZABETH, CANADA'S HEAD OF STATE AND THE LONGEST-REIGNING BRITISH MONARCH, HAS DIED. SHE WAS 96.

She died peacefully on Thursday afternoon at Balmoral Castle in Scotland, Buckingham Palace said in a short statement.

Queen Elizabeth, became Queen in 1952, at the relatively tender age of 25, and presided over the country and the Commonwealth, including Canada, for seven decades. Those 70 years as monarch were recognized during this year's Platinum Jubilee events, which reached their height in London in early June.

In her time as monarch, Elizabeth bore witness to profound changes at home and abroad, including the decline of the British Empire and decolonization of many African and Caribbean countries, along with the end of hostilities with Irish republicans.

INTERESTED IN BECOMING CATHOLIC?

We believe that God calls individuals to live the Good News Jesus proclaimed and to become his disciples as members of the Catholic Church. If you want to become Catholic, you will participate in a process called the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (sometimes called RCIA or simply Christian initiation). In RCIA, you will learn about the teachings of Jesus as the Catholic Church has handed them on put these teachings into practice by living as part of the Catholic community, serving others and praying.

A JOURNEY IN FAITH What does RCIA entail?

If you have NOT been baptized,

the Christian initiation process prepared you to become a Catholic Christian by celebrating the sacraments of Christian initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Communion.

If you have been baptized in another Christian tradition,

the initiation process prepared you to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church by celebrating the sacraments of Confirmation and Holy Communion.

I'm a baptized Catholic, is RCIA for me?

If you have been baptized as an infant, but have not received further formal instruction in the Catholic Faith nor the sacraments of Confirmation or the Eucharist, RCIA is indeed for you. If you have fully initiated Catholic who wishes to deepen your faith, contact the Parish Office about the possibility of participating.

How long does it take to become a Catholic?

Becoming Catholic is a life-long commitment. However, the Christian initiation process typically lasts for few months in order to prepare to take this step. Participants in the initiation process generally meet at least once a week. Here at Sts. Peter & Paul our program will begin, September 27, 2022 @ 7:00 pm at our Parish Church. Father will use the program called, "The Search" (7 weeks program) found in our FORMED database. The Second part will take place in the New Year. The initiation of individuals who are ready to make the commitment to become new members of the Catholic Church usually take

Year. The initiation of individuals who are ready to make the commitment to become new members of the Catholic Church usually take place at Easter (Easter this coming year is April 9, 2023).
