## THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME 15TH JANUARY 2023

This Sunday's gospel opens with the preaching of Jesus. The time of prophecy has ended with the arrest of the Baptist. He had to decrease so the other could increase. The gates of the prison have been closed upon this great voice. Up to this time Jesus has been silent. Henceforth he must proclaim that the kingdom is here.

This proclamation begins surprisingly at this frontier crossroads of Galilee. Common opinion held that nothing good could come from Galilee. (John 1:46) It was to this people, then under subjection, that Isaiah had announced the messianic light of the Immanuel. It is again to them that Jesus addresses himself. He is the one who brings glad tidings, announcing peace, bearing good news, announcing salvation, and saying to Zion, "Your God is King." (Isa 52:7). This dawn of the kingdom calls for a change of heart.

From this moment on, the Messiah had some faithful followers. The memory of their fidelity of Jesus remains. Here the Church is born.



## **MAINTAINING A PRAYERFUL ENVIRONMENT**

ROMANS 15:6 "SO THAT TOGETHER YOU MAY WITH ONE VOICE FLORIFY GOD" (EPISTLE OF 2ND SUNDAY OF ADVENT) St. Paul exhorts us to live in harmony and, in order to ensure the Sacredness and Transcendence of the Litrugy, it is important to express this harmony in our voice.

The Liturgy is an act of prayer & praise by using prose & poetry in "one voice" together. Our words spoken at Mass are not in our conversational style but rather are formal & melodic. Though not louder than our conversational style but rather are formal & melodic. Though no louder than our common parlance, yet words are prayed with a rhythm and are deliberate (not in a rush); most importantly, spoken in harmony & at the same pace (unison) as everyone else.

The priest celebrant sets the tone and pace of the spoken word. We are to follow his lead. To bring all together as one, it is necessary to "think before we speak": i.e. take a breath, before we respond "Amen", "And with your Spirit" etc...; pauses allow for reflection. Silence throughout the Liturgy reveals its true sacredness & transcendence. Pope Benedict: "The greater Mystery, surpasses all words, summons us to silence... We should expect the Liturgy to give us a positive stillness that will restore us." (Spirit of the Liturgy: 2000).

"WHEN CHILDREN CHATTER" - We ask that you take them for a walk, either to the family room on the left of the sanctuary or to the vestibule, which is now wired for sound, though, not sound proof. We appreciate your assistance in this matter so all the words of Holy Mass may be easily heard. Thank-you.

<u>FAMILY WITH SMALL CHILDREN SEATING:</u> On Weekends the left (east) back bench is reserved for parents with young children—even after Mass has begun. Thank you for your consideration & cooperation.

## POPE BENEDICT XVI QUOTES ABOUT ADORATION

"In a world where there is so much noise, so much bewilderment, there is a need for silent adoration of Jesus concealed in the Host. Be assiduous in the prayer of adoration and teach it to the faithful. It is a source of comfort and light, particularly to those who are suffering."

"Receiving the Eucharist means adoring Him who we receive. Only in tis way do we become one with Him, and are given, as it were, a foretaste of the beauty of the heavenly liturgy. The act of adoration outside Mass prolongs and intensifies all that takes place during the liturgical celebration itself."

"In the Eucharist, the Son of God comes to meet us and desires to become one with us; Eucharistic adoration is simply the natural consequence of the Eucharistic celebration, which is itself the Church's supreme act of adoration."

"We cannot live, we cannot look at the truth about ourselves without letting ourselves be looked at and generated by Christ in daily Eucharistic Adoration."

"Adoration outside Holy Mass prolongs and intensifies what has taken place in the liturgical celebration and makes a true and profound reception of Christ possible. I... warmly recommend, to Pastors and to all the faithful, the practice of Eucharistic adoration."


## Interested in Becoming Catholic?



How long does it take to become a Catholic?
Becoming Catholic is a life-long commitment.
However, the Christian initiation process typically lasts for few months in order to prepare to take this step. Participants in the initiation process generally meet at least once a week. Here at Sts. Peter & Paul our program will begin, Tuesday, September 27, 2022 @ 7:00 pm

at our Parish Church. Father will use the program called, "The Search" (7 weeks program) found in our FORMED database. The Second part will take place in the New Year. The initiation of individuals who are ready to make the commitment to become new members of the Catholic Church usually take place at Easter (Easter this coming year is Saturday, April 8, 2023).
