THIS SUNDAY'S READING, SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME 5TH FEBRUARY 2023

Today's gospel complements the previous accounts of the beatitudes. "Happy are you!" declared Jesus to those to whom he announced persecution. Today he reveals who they are. They are the salt of the earth and the light of world. The images must be explored. The scriptures prescribed use of salt, a covenant sign, on all the offering made of God. (Lev 2:13, Num 18:19). Salt was also considered a fertilizer. For Israel, light was a symbol of messianic revelation triumphing over the darkness of paganism.

We must live, then, as salt for the earth and light for the world. The prophet Isaiah points the way. If we pursue justice for the oppressed and care for those in need, we will be true to our mission to preserve, to nurture and to enlighten all humanity. Through our lives, Jesus Christ, the true light of the world, will shine on in the darkness, a darkness that will not overcome it (John 1:5).



MAINTAINING A PRAYERFUL ENVIRONMENT



ROMANS 15:6 “SO THAT TOGETHER YOU MAY WITH ONE VOICE FLORIFY GOD” (EPISTLE OF 2ND SUNDAY OF ADVENT)
St. Paul exhorts us to live in harmony and, in order to ensure the Sacredness and Transcendence of the Liturgy, it is important to express this harmony in our voice.

The Liturgy is an act of prayer & praise by using prose & poetry in “one voice” together. Our words spoken at Mass are not in our conversational style but rather are formal & melodic. Not louder than our conversational style, rather they are formal & melodic. No louder than our common parlance, yet words are prayed with a rhythm and are deliberate (not in a rush); most importantly, spoken in harmony & at the same pace (unison) as everyone else.

The priest celebrant sets the tone and pace of the spoken word. We are to follow his lead. To bring all together as one, it is necessary to “think before we speak”: i.e. take a breath, before we respond “Amen”, “And with your Spirit” etc...; pauses allow for reflection. Silence throughout the Liturgy reveals its true sacredness & transcendence. Pope Benedict: “The greater Mystery, surpasses all words, summons us to silence... We should expect the Liturgy to give us a positive stillness that will restore us.” (Spirit of the Liturgy: 2000).

“WHEN CHILDREN CHATTER” - We ask that you take them for a walk, either **to the family room on the left of the sanctuary** or to the vestibule, which is now wired for sound, though, not sound proof. We appreciate your assistance in this matter so all the words of Holy Mass may be easily heard. Thank-you.

FAMILY WITH SMALL CHILDREN SEATING: On Weekends the two (2) left (east) back bench are reserved for parents with young children—even after Mass has begun. Thank you for your consideration & cooperation.

NB: The Building Fund contributions are not taxed by the Diocese, whereas the regular Sunday contributions are taxed at 14%.

RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION



The Conference of Bishops gives directives to how to “physically” receive Holy Communion.

Post Pandemic re-start warrants a refresher for us all.

Unless one is infirmed these norms are to be followed. In this way, the priest knows that you are practicing and attentive; for he is the guardian of ensuring reverence for the Blessed Sacrament.

When receiving on the hand, either kneeling or standing, the following are the Church’s directives:

- Make a cross with both hands, left on the right, slightly cupped (Father should not touch your hand; not too cupped)
- Take the host with you underneath right hand and place in your mouth (& perhaps then make the sign of the cross).
- If kneeling, then stand and return down the side aisle to your seat, only after you have received.

Not to Do:

- Stand & walk away before receiving
- Put the host in your mouth with the hand of receiving (scooping)

NB: pandemic instructions given about the mask: remove mask at rail or after your “Amen” before you receive in hand, would still apply for those who wear a mask.

Father will take extra precautions to cleanse regularly, if there is any touching when receiving in the hand or on the tongue.

ALTAR SERVERS:



There is a need for Altar servers at our Masses. Young men & boys (Grade 3 +) are invited to serve at the weekend Masses. Simply contact the parish office & Father will give them simple instructions.

Thank you for stepping forward, saying “yes” and thus adding to the dignity of Holy Mass.


FORMED
