THIS SUNDAY'S READING, SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME 12TH FEBRUARY 2023

The New Testament is explicit: there is one Law of Christ and it is new. Far from abolishing the old Law, this Law fulfils it by emphasizing interior observance. This law calls for justice which surpasses that of the scribes and Pharisees. This law is radical because the call of Jesus goes beyond the letter to a more authentic life. For Jesus, the human heart is decisive.

Hatred is prohibited: anger is the beginning of murder. Coveting another's spouse is forbidden: there are looks which are as bad as adultery. Repudiation of a spouse is not allowed: this can only come from the hardness of heart. (Matt 19:8). The making of oaths, true or false, is not permitted: it is enough to be fully committed to our word.

We who believe that the gospel is not some sweet, indulgent consolation, are confronted by unprecedented demands without compromise. We could have the impression of being trapped. Why should we be surprised that there is within us as in the disciples something that is indignant, when Jesus abruptly declares that riches are an impediment to the kingdom: "Then who can be saved?" (Mark 10:26). Christian morality is impossible without the support of life in Christ, consciously lived. Without him, we can do nothing. With him, everything is possible. To put on the mind of Christ is the only way to fulfil the law in spirit and in truth.

MAINTAINING A PRAYERFUL ENVIRONMENT

ROMANS 15:6 "SO THAT TOGETHER YOU MAY WITH ONE VOICE FLORIFY GOD" (EPISTLE OF 2ND SUNDAY OF ADVENT) St. Paul exhorts us to live in harmony and, in order to ensure the Sacredness and Transcendence of the Liturgy, it is important to express this harmony in our voice.

The Liturgy is an act of prayer & praise by using prose & poetry in "one voice" together. Our words spoken at Mass are not in our conversational style but rather are formal & melodic. Not louder than our conversational style, rather they are formal & melodic. No louder than our common parlance, yet words are prayed with a rhythm and are deliberate (not in a rush); most importantly, spoken in harmony & at the same pace (unison) as everyone else.

The priest celebrant sets the tone and pace of the spoken word. We are to follow his lead. To bring all together as one, it is necessary to "think before we speak": i.e. take a breath, before we respond "Amen", "And with your Spirit" etc...; pauses allow for reflection. Silence throughout the Liturgy reveals its true sacredness & transcendence. Pope Benedict: "The greater Mystery, surpasses all words, summons us to silence... We should expect the Liturgy to give us a positive stillness that will restore us." (Spirit of the Liturgy: 2000).

<u>"WHEN CHILDREN CHATTER"</u> - We ask that you take them for a walk, either **to the family room on the left of the sanctuary** or to the vestibule, which is now wired for sound, though, not sound proof. We appreciate your assistance in this matter so all the words of Holy Mass may be easily heard. Thank-you.

<u>FAMILY WITH SMALL CHILDREN SEATING:</u> On Weekends the two (2) left (east) back bench are reserved for parents with young children—even after Mass has begun. Thank you for your consideration & cooperation.
