THIS SUNDAY'S READING, EVENTH ORDINARY TIME 18TH JUNE

Jesus is enlisting support. His heart is touched by the crowds he encounters: the tired, the abused, the sand and those abandoned by their shepherds. Alone, he will never be able to accomplish the task of ministry. He needs help. He enlists twelve apostles, for the twelve tribes of Israel, for the whole world. The enormity of this work seems out of proportion to the resources at hand: a few fishermen, tax collector, a freedom fighter, a traitor-in-waiting, and a few about whom we know nothing. Their only source of unity was the person of Jesus.

To bet the harvest-master is the first necessity. The disciples are called to continue the Lord's work, not their own. Without prayer, it is impossible to give ourselves to the mission. We risk preaching ourselves rather than Christ, making the apostolate our own rather than the kingdom's, being engaged in the harvest for our own profit.

The apostles are commissioned to "go after the lost sheep of the house of Israel" because the urgency of their distress. The universal mission will come later. Both in Israel and beyond, the fundamental command is to seek the lost. Compassion is at the heart of every pastoral strategy. It reaches the most inaccessible places where the flock was wandered. At that frontier, Jesus struggles side by side with his disciples to heal, to liberate and to forgive. To cast our lot with the most deprived is already to show them their beginning and their end: the one kingdom prepared by the tenderness of a God who freely gives all.

THE INTERIOR OF SAINTS PETER AND PAUL CHURCH:

Our Church has the usual 3 sections:

-Vestibule or Narthex

-Nave

-Sanctuary.

The VESTIBULE is a place of social gathering and a place of preparation for us to be composed to enter into the Church.

The NAVE is the place in the Church Building for the Congregation. It is between the Sanctuary and the Entry of the Church Building. The term 'Nave' derives from the Latin 'NAVIS' meaning 'SHIP'; which is an early Symbol of the Church.

The SANCTUARY is the place of the Holies of Holies: the Heavenly Jerusalem.

The three shades of gold colour (Royal Gold, Glorious Gold and Richest Gold) here accentuate the Glory of Heaven, here on earth, through the Sacred Actions of the Liturgy and the Presence of the Blessed Sacrament

It is seen that the NAVE represents life here on earth. Everyday life ('Ordinary Time') is depicted with the colour of the green flooring. Yet, even here on earth there is a glimpse already of heaven. This is dramatically shown not only by the glorious stained-glass windows of the Saints of the Beatitudes but also by the hint of the gold surrounding them.

It is in this way, with the help of the Saints, that we too might one day enter the Heavenly Jerusalem. For instance, the gold surrounding the Stained-Glass windows is the same gold of the first two side walls of the Sanctuary; leading us onwards. This gold intensifies at the arched wall and then ultimately at the far end of the Sanctuary.

The Lighting in the Sanctuary still needs some adjustments in order to highlight certain special areas.

9—10 December


