#### Sunday's Reading First Sunday of Advent **December 3, 2023**

"Oh, that you would rend the heavens and come down..." Once again, at the beginning of Advent, this cry rises to God, borne up by the certainty of a kingdom already among us but not yet completed. For our God is God who comes: "He who was, and who is, and who is to come!" (Rev 4:8). Once again, we must situate ourselves properly before this mystery which manifestation of the Lord. That is an old temptation to which troubled societies regularly succumb. Even today many sects set themselves up as prophets of doom. It is not date of the Parousia but its character which must concern us. It will pronounce judgement on all history and on our personal lives. In the face of this coming of the Son of Man which no one can foresee or prevent, if this world, it is best always on the alert, to be aware of our responsibility toward the present, and to recognize the eternal significance of every moment.

Paul calls the vigilant Christian to give thanks without ceasing. Thanksgiving is not an expression of smug complacency. With this awareness of what we are not yet and do not yet do, we turn towards the One who is the beginning and the end of all things. We renounce what delays and announce what hastens his coming. Then, like a thorn in the world's flesh, we become a goad to the world's vigilance, triumphing over sleep and stirring up hope.

#### Get to Know Jesus Through the Liturgical Year

1). Advent

The word Advent—meaning the coming—refers to the days and weeks before Christmas, as well as preparation for Christmas. There are always four Sundays in the Advent Season. The Liturgical colour is that of Purple, aside from Memorials, Feast Days and Solemnities.

Symbol One of the key symbols illuminating this Season is that of the <u>Advent Wreath</u>. Made in the form of a circle and green, the Advent wreath is decorated often with a red ribbon, sometimes an apple, but the key elements are candles. The circular symbolic sacramental has four distinct candles; three are purple and one is pink.

On Christmas, the fifth candle is inserted in the very middle of the Advent wreath—white in contrast to pink and purple. That white candle in the middle signifies the Birthday of Jesus, who is truly the Light of the world who came to dispel the darkness of sin.

2) Marian Feasts

Given that Advent has a very important Marian tone, there are two important Marian Liturgical celebrations: the Immaculate Conception (December 8); then <u>Our Lady of Guadalupe</u> (December 12). In all of the Advent Season, the Church joyfully awaits the Birthday of Jesus with Our Lady, the expectant Mother of Jesus.

3) St. John the Baptist

Furthermore, a key Biblical figure is Saint John the Baptist, who calls us to prepare the way for the Birthday of the Savior.*I*.

Advent concludes with Christmas and the Christmas Season. Impossible to celebrate the Birthday of Jesus—the most important birthday in the world—in one day. There must be an Octave as well as an extended Season to rejoice because Jesus, Our Saviour, is born. Christmas already starts with Christmas Eve. The long-awaited day has arrived: Jesus is born of the Virgin Mary

#### HOLY DAYS OF OBLIGATION

Along with the 52 Sundays of the Year , in Canada, we have 2 other Holy Days of Obligation: Christmas and New Year (Mother of God).

Consequently this year, there are 4 days of Obligation within a span of 9 days: 4th Sunday of Advent, Christmas,, Holy Family Sunday and Mother of God (New Year).

Here at Sts. Peter & Paul are these Masses:

Sun/Mon Dec 24/25 (CHRISTMAS) Dec 24th –4pm and 6pm Dec 25th—9am and 11am

Sat/Sun Dec 30/31(HOLY FAMILY SUNDAY) Dec 30—5pm Dec 31—9am and 11am

Sun/Mon Dec 31/Jan 1st (MOTHER OF GOD NEW YEAR) Dec 31—4pm {Holy Hour 11pm-12midnight} Jan 1st—9am and 11am

## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:

An update on our New Parish Centre Project to be built on the west side of the Church: (1450 W 38th and 1449 W 39th and the lane in between these): Virtually, the city has given necessary approval to move ahead. Our challenge now is to finance this. The total construction cost is estimated at 14.5 Million. We have an offer to purchase Cartier Hall for 8.5 Million. This means that we still need to raise 6.5 Million to pay for this project. Our present parish cash flow only covers operating expenses. Extra donations are required; including by contributions to the Parish Building Fund & Project Advance. An overview of the entire New Centre Building (one long one going from 38th to 39th): the 38th side (2 stories) would be the Great Parish Hall (named after Sts. Peter & Paul) with a connecting kitchen (named after St. Andrew the hospitality apostle). Nearby (on the Church side) would be the Conference Hall (named after St. James the Great) towards 39th would be the Adoration Chapel (named after St. John the Beloved). West of these (towards the neighbour: 1459 W 39th) would be the Office Wing (named after St. Matthew the tax collector). Upstairs on the 39th side would be more meeting rooms (named after all the other Apostles). Below all this would be underground parking and elevators throughout. These 12 rooms would be dedicated by the donor as they so pleased. If you might be interested in doing this, please let me know. I can't help but to remember that this Centre was Fr. John Horgan's dream; thus the Chapel of Adoration will be named after his patron. In the meantime, also, our Project Advance campaign for 2023 continues to assist this project, pledge forms for this are next to the bulletin. Our gratitude for your kind consideration in these matters that can bring about the needed growth to our parish life.


Otherwise, the collection is taken up at each Mass. From this we received:
