#### **5 SAINT JOHN PAUL II QUOTES THAT WILL INSPIRE YOU THIS LENT**

Each year during his pontificate, <u>St. Pope John Paul II</u> addressed the church community with a Lenten message. Below are five quotes from the Lenten messages of <u>St. John Paul</u> that can help encourage and strengthen our personal <u>Lenten journeys</u>.

#### Saint John Paul II Quote about Lent Being a Time to Recognize Our True Homeland

"Christ has gained for us not only new dignity in our life on earth, but above all the new dignity of the children of God, called to share eternal life with him. Lent invites us to overcome the temptation of seeing the realities of this world as definitive and to recognize that 'our homeland is in heaven' (Phil 3:20)"—St. John Paul II, "Message of John Paul II for Lent 1999"

Christ, as the Redeemer who died to save us, calls us to eternal life in Heaven. The time of Lent reminds us that our earthly life is a journey to our true home. The spiritual writer, Romano Guardini, said, "Man's real world is, as it were, above him. Praising God means ascending into that homeland of our spirit where, it may be said, we truly live." Through the story of Lent, we encounter our call to eternal life and look to heaven as our homeland.

#### Saint John Paul II Quote about Lent Being a Time to Rediscover Ourselves

"Lent is a time of truth. Christians, called by the Church to prayer, penance, fasting and self-sacrifice, place themselves before God and recognize themselves; they rediscover themselves." —St. John Paul II, "Message of His Holiness John Paul II for Lent 1981"

St. John Paul calls us during Lent to rediscover the truth about ourselves. In this message, he specifically addresses the human person and tells us to remember that we are made for more than material and worldly goods (i.e. <a href="Level 2 happiness">Level 2 happiness</a>). According to St. John Paul, Lent is a time to put life back in its proper place and remember two things about ourselves: we came from God, and we are journeying back to Him through the <a href="Resurrection">Resurrection</a>. Our Lenten acts place us before God and help us recognize this profound truth about ourselves.

#### Saint John Paul II Quote about Lent Being a Time of Connection With Others

"These are the precious weeks [of Lent] offered by the Church to all Christians, in order to help them to reflect upon their profound identity as children of the heavenly Father and as brothers and sisters of all human beings."—St. John Paul II, "Message of His Holiness John Paul II for Lent 1983"

The time of Lent reminds us of our interconnection and relationship with all human beings through the shared identity we have as children of the heavenly Father. This recognition can help draw us to the charity <u>St. Augustine</u> calls us to when he said, "Food is subservient to charity, speech to charity, and facial expressions to charity. Everything works together for Charity alone."

As the Church takes this time of Lent to show all of us our profound identity as children of God, it can encourage our fasting and interactions with others to work for the sake of <u>charity</u>. We then see that we practice charity not toward random individuals but toward people who share a connection with us .through their gift to also <u>call God</u> "Father." - to be continued on next page

Saint John Paul II Quote about Lent Being a Time to Make a Gift of Ourselves to the Father

"At the end of Lent, the celebration of the Paschal Mystery shows how the Lenten journey of purification culminates in the free and loving gift of self to the Father." —St. John Paul II, "Message of the Holy Father John Paul II for Lent 1997"

St. John Paul tells us how our Lenten journey ends in the same way it ends for Christ, namely, making a gift of ourselves to the Father through the cross. In Mere Christianity, <u>C.S. Lewis</u> says, "What we have been told is how we men can be drawn into Christ—can become part of that wonderful present which the young Prince of the universe wants to offer to His Father—that present which is Himself and therefore us in Him. It is the only thing we were made for."

Lent helps us fulfill the very thing we were made for, namely, to make a gift of ourselves to the Father. As <u>C.S. Lewis</u> indicates, this is the very same gift Christ wants to offer. Lent is a special time of grace when we are drawn into Christ and, with him, offer ourselves as a free and loving gift to the Father.

## READINGS: FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Mark is interested in the link between the miraculous activity of the messiah and the awakening of faith. Faith leads people to ask Jesus for healing. Healing leads them to the total commitment of faith.

The cure of Peter's mother-in-law suggests more that Christ's extraordinary power over a sick body. In a clipped account, Mark demonstrates his interest in the meaning of the event: the healing of bodies is aimed at wholeness of spirits. This same narrative implies a model for every believer. Made whole by the power of Jesus, we too must devote our full energy to serving the Lord.

This model is not easy. Enthusiasm for miraculous cures is not enough. All the crippled & possessed of Capernaum crowd in front of Simon & Andrew's house because they see Jesus only as a wonderworker. Jesus slips awe. He takes refuge in solitude & prayer, to search out the real meaning of his mission. He is first of all the sower gone out to spread the Word (Mark 4:3). His word more than his miracle must move us.



## **Building Fund**

We are moving forward with having our own Parish Centre, this massive project will take the efforts of many people to support. If you can please consider giving to the Building Fund, every cent of the Building Fund will go towards this Parish Goal.

### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:

An update on our New Parish Centre Project to be built on the west side of the Church: (1450 W 38th and 1449 W 39th and the lane in between these): Virtually, the city has given necessary approval to move ahead. Our challenge now is to finance this. The total construction cost is estimated at 14.5 Million. We have an offer to purchase Cartier Hall for 8.5 Million. This means that we still need to raise 6.5 Million to pay for this project. Our present parish cash flow only covers operating expenses. Extra donations are required; including by contributions to the Parish Building Fund & Project Advance. An overview of the entire New Centre Building (one long one going from 38th to 39th): the 38th side (2 stories) would be the Great Parish Hall (named after Sts. Peter & Paul) with a connecting kitchen (named after St. Andrew the hospitality apostle). Nearby (on the Church side) would be the Conference Hall (named after St. James the Great) towards 39th would be the Adoration Chapel (named after St. John the Beloved). West of these (towards the neighbour: 1459 W 39th) would be the Office Wing (named after St. Matthew the tax collector). Upstairs on the 39th side would be more meeting rooms (named after all the other Apostles). Below all this would be underground parking and elevators throughout. These 12 rooms would be dedicated by the donor as they so pleased. If you might be interested in doing this, please let me know. I can't help but to remember that this Centre was Fr. John Horgan's dream; thus the Chapel of Adoration will be named after his patron. In the meantime, also, our Project Advance campaign for 2023 continues to assist this project, pledge forms for this are next to the bulletin. Our gratitude for your kind consideration in these matters that can bring about the needed growth to our parish life.
