SUNDAY READINGS: BAPTISM OF THE LORD

The annual season of light draws to a close. January may be quite bleak in northern climates, but the solstice has passed. Light has won out over darkness and we have celebrated the bright hope of salvation. We have ritualized once more the cherished customs of Christmas.

Families, stores, and communities regularly package their Christmas decor and store it away for eleven months. For the Church, our season of birth and manifestation is not packed up and stored. The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord does not tie up all the loose ends of the plot or neatly summarize the mystery. It remembers one more aspect of Christmas, but it also sets the stage for the

week-by-week unfolding of the mystery of Jesus through the recounting of each synoptic gospel.

The evangelists present the baptism of Jesus at the start of His public life because the varied detail of their accounts unveil His identity. Like the servant praised in Isaiah, Jesus has come to do God's will. He is consecrated in the Spirit. He is the Beloved Son.

These proclamations about Jesus summon us to a fuller awareness of the paschal mystery. Through baptism we are the body of Christ, facing the same mystery of dying and rising. We too must be open to the Spirit, conscious of our relationship to God. Thus we can live a life of discipleship and begin to understand the true meaning of history.

A blessed Jubilee New Year of 2025 to us all.

The Liturgical Year, as it begins on December 1, is a month ahead of the Calendar Year. In this way we experience the unfolding of Advent and Christmas to ready us with new insight; in order then to enter into the New Year of 2025. The number marks out all these many years of graces that Our Lord has shared over all this amount of time. How providential it is that the Christmas Season arches over the past year of 2024 and leads us, into the New Year, experiencing, we pray, an increase of gratitude this Christmas, for the Father's gift to us of his Son.

The 12 days of Christmas continue with the glorious Solemnity of the Epiphany of our Lord. The shepherds of Judaism have the revelation to them of an Angel to proclaim Christ's birth. The wise men of the Orient, the Gentiles, have the revelation to them by a Star to proclaim Christ's birth. These Magi were men of science, astronomy, and history. We note that the revelation to them both was from their own lived experience.

A special (optional) liturgical act after the Gospel of the Epiphany is the chanting of 'The Announcement of Easter and the Movable Feasts': "Know that as we have rejoiced at the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ, so by leave of God's mercy we announce to you also the joy of his Resurrection, who is our Saviour... on the 20th day of April, you will celebrate with joy Easter Day."

Indeed, as 'Hark the Herald Angels Sing' tells us: "Born that we no more might die, Born to raise us from the earth, Born to give us second birth." and 'We Three Kings' with their gifts of Gold for the King, Frankincense for God and Myrrh for the Sacrifice: "Sorrowing sighing, Bleeding dying, Sealed in the stone-cold tomb."

As people of Faith: born to die, born to raise us from the earth, born to give us second birth, leads us fittingly to his Passion, Death & Resurrection. This is why Easter is the Most Important Feast of the Year! Christmas/Epiphany point to this.

In the Christmas Season St. Luke accounts the way in which Jesus grows and matures: "the child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favour of God was upon him." (Lk. 2:40) and further: "Then he went down with them and came to Nazareth and was obedient to them... and Jesus increased in wisdom and in years and in favour with God and men." (Lk 2:51-52)

The Jubliee Years have special graces: 1975 was declared a Year of Reconciliation & Renewal; 2000 was declared as a Year of the Celebration of God's Mercy & Forgiveness; and this our Jubilee New Year of 2025 is declared as a Year of Fraternity & Hope. May St. Luke's accounting of the way in which our Lord's growth occurred, be that example for us all, in this Special Jubilee New Year, of how we should live it out; "to live in favour with God and men"

Also, St. Luke at these references adds "But Mary treasured these things and pondered them in her heart." (Lk 2:19 & Lk. 2:51). May, then Mary, Mother of God and the Church, help us too to treasure why and how all these great things continue to come about and fully shared with us.
