

Wednesdays to Fridays from 12 noon to 3 pm.


FORMED New Formed Program

SUNDAY READINGS: FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

The gospel tradition joins the account of Jesus' temptation by Satan to the story of his baptism. Led into the desert by the Spirit received at the Jordan, Jesus is subjected to trial during his forty day fast. Here Luke seizes the occasion to present the two protagonists of a drama which will reach its climax at "the appointed hour," Good Friday. By confronting his principal antagonist at the beginning of his public life, Jesus clarifies his understanding of the messianic role.

First, he does not use his power as magic for selfish ends. Second, he situates his sovereignty as Son of God in relation to his political realities of this world. His reign is subject only to God from who he has received all that he is. Finally, led to Jerusalem to endure the passion, he refuses to tempt his father by demanding special protection, although it would vindicate his unique claim.

Every Christian is tempted: by the worship of money, by the expansion of political power exercised with disdain for human rights, and by the reduction of religion to a tool of human ambition. These are so many masks donned by the devil who is most clever when he makes us doubt his existence. Like the Son of God in the desert, we are called in this time of prayer and fasting to reidentify our Christian Vocation.

Lent 2025

Dear parishioners,

We are about to enter into the most important annual penitential season of the 40 days of Lent; March 5th begin Ash Wednesday.

It is helpful to put the Liturgical Year in perspective with the calendar of months forthcoming:

March & the better part of April, we live out this season of Lent & Holy Week.

April 20th Easter Day and the rest of April and all of May we celebrate the joy of the Easter Season (50 days).

Then June this year has every Sunday (5 of them!) as a Solemnity:

- -Ascension (1st)
- -Pentecost (8th)
- -Holy Trinity (15th)
- -Corpus Christi (22nd)
- -and this year: Sts. Peter & Paul (29th).

In Lent, we begin our journey towards Easter. As always, the 2nd Sunday of Lent captures this journey with the Transfiguration of our Lord, where like Peter, James & John, we need to be: first one with Our Lord in his Passion in order, only then, to be one with him in his Glory. The Ash Wednesday (pray, fast, almsgiving) & the First Sunday of Lent (3 temptations of pride, indulgence & greed) Gospels have our Lord showing us how to live out these days; that the virtue of Ash Wednesday's exhortation are to be the remedy; i.e. prayer for pride, fasting for indulgence and almsgiving for greed. Good self-knowledge and examination bring us to know what vice so readily clings to our hearts and so help us embrace the penitential practice that will assist us best morally. As one pastor is fond of saying, giving up chocolate may not get to the heart of our real spiritual need!

Bishop Hugh Gilbert of Aberdeen gives helpful insight from his book: "Unfolding the Mystery" #9: "Enter Lent to help us repent and return to Easter life... Why fast, pray and give alms? Simply and solely to regain the vision and the taste of the kingdom of God... Lent is a restoration to life... let us note the time of year it occurs... in Spring, when frosts are ending, the days are growing longer and the whole countryside turns to life."

May this holy season prepare us well for Easter joy; for in Dying he destroyed our death and in Rising he restored our life.
