


#### Man's Destiny 2025 - Step Into Your Calling


## **FORMED** New Formed Program

#### **SUNDAY READINGS: THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD**

The Ascension is one facet of the rich Easter mystery. The reading from Acts relates the event of Jesus leaving His apostles. As a natural or supernatural phenomenon, it certainly merits considerable fascination. Yet the New Testament leaves us without details. We too can gaze up into the heavens and wonder about the Ascension, but this day is not really about a departure.

It is a day that unfolds the promise that will return. It reminds us that Jesus is with us always. Indeed Christ is the vibrant head of the Church which is His body. We do not observe a departure. We celebrate a presence.

Thus this day in the fifty-day sweep of Easter is a peculiarly opportune time for relishing our hope and status. We can discover Christ's presence at every turn, renew our flagging spirits with tastes of the kingdom. It simply takes eyes of faith, our innermost vision that sees the great hope, glorious heritage, and immeasurable scope of Christ's power.

We should approach this day with open hearts. We do not gather at Eucharist to have the Ascension explained or to memorize exegetical points. We come to be inspired, to offer praise, proclaim the risen One who never leaves us.

#### The Solemnities of the Ascension and Pentecost:

Dear parishioners,

In an earlier message, I took the opportunity to highlight that the five Sundays of June this year are all special Solemnities; namely: June 1st: Ascension, June 8th: Pentecost, June 15th: Holy Trinity, June 22nd: 'Corpus Christi,' and June 29th: Saints Peter and Paul.

On the 40th day of Easter, that is, the Ascension, we celebrate the conclusion of our Lord's earthly life. Saint Luke the Evangelist, in his second book, the 'Acts of the Apostles' shared that he had already: "In the first book (the Gospel of Luke)... dealt with all that Jesus began to do and teach until the day he was taken up" (1:1,2). Also, in this book: he "presented himself alive after his passion by many proofs, appearing to them during forty days" (1:3).

Then, Luke Shares of our Lord's words to us: "You shall be baptized by the Holy Spirit" (1:5) and "you shall receive the power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you" (1:8).

So: "as they were looking on, he was lifted up and the cloud took him out of their sight," (1:9) with the promise: "This Jesus who was taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven" (1.11).

Our Nicene Creed makes special reference to the result of the Lord's Ascension, namely: "He is seated (present tense) at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead." And the Eucharistic Preface prays: "he ascended, not to distance himself from our lowly state but that we, his members, might be confident of following where he our Head and Founder, has gone before." "He is seated" is literally, the 'as we speak' reality; and from there, as Head of the Church, he continues to grace the Church on earth for he is: "with us always until the close of the age" (Mt.28:20).

The Christian Pentecost shares out the promised gift of the Holy Spirit to be the Soul; the Life-giving Principle of the Church. How helpful for us also, is the Solemnity that follows Pentecost, namely the Holy Trinity, in order for the Church to realize the full impact of the Holy Spirit as the shared love of the Father and the Son.

To prepare for this outpouring with the 9 days between the Ascension and Pentecost is the original 9 days (Novena) where Mary and the Apostles wait and pray in the Upper Room for this to occur. We do well also to pray in preparation for Pentecost anew for us.

In Liturgy, the Church renders to the present moment all the saving works of salvation into the present age, so that the present believers of the Church might also experience the fruit of all these graces anew.

Blessed Abbot Columba Marmion (+1923) wrote, in his book 'Christ in His Mysteries' about Pentecost and the significance of the 'Tongues of Fire' and the 'Powerful Wind.'

Of all these he wrote that: "The Holy Spirit appeared under the form of tongues of fire in order to fill the Apostles with Truth and to prepare them to bear witness to Jesus. He also came to fill their hearts with Love." In the 'Powerful Wind': "the Divine Spirit communicated such an abundance of life to the whole Church that to symbolize it 'there came a sound from heaven, as of a Powerful Wind coming, and it filled the whole house where they (the Apostles) were sitting.'"

Then, Abbot Marmion prepares us in the present day: "But it is also for us that the Holy Spirit has come... to remain with the Church forever. This is the promise of Jesus Himself. He dwells in the Church permanently and unfailingly, performing in it without ceasing His action of life-giving and sanctification. He establishes the Church infallibly in the truth. It is he who makes the Church blossom forth with a marvelous supernatural fruitfulness."

In conclusion, of the dozen Solemnities throughout the Liturgical Year, there are three that stand out as the most important. These, in a special way share the work of the 3 persons of the Trinity: Christmas: God the Father's love in giving us his Son, Easter: God the Son's love, and Pentecost: God the Holy Spirit's love.

Surely, Pentecost should have its greater impact in our lives. The promised gift of the Holy Spirit brings about the Birthday of the Church (that was conceived in the side of Christ crucified). For, as 'Acts' reminds us: "This Jesus God raised up, and of that, we all are witnesses" (2:32).

For, spiritually we too at Pentecost experience the 'Tongues of Fire': in his Gift of Truth and Love, and the 'Powerful Wind': in his Gift of Courage and Peace.

# From the Pastor's Desk: Project Advance 2025 Letter

My dear Parishioners of Sts. Peter & Paul Parish, Especially in this season of Easter, we remember Jesus' words: "Behold, I make all things new" (Rev. 21:5). This newness is now historically so in the Catholic Church, with the gift of our new Pope, Leo XIV. His inaugural words to us emphasized the need for the Faith in order to give meaning to life itself. The Popes have often stated that 95% of the Church's life & ministry is found on the parish level.

Here at Sts. Peter & Paul parish we provide the opportunity for the people of God to worship Him and be guided and strengthened to share Him with others. Our parish celebrates the Eucharist as the source and summit of the Christian life. Along with this, we provide prayerful, spiritual, educational and social activities in order for parishioners to live and deepen their faith; for themselves and for others.

As your pastor for these past four years, it gives me special joy to see an increase of membership, and ongoing inquiry to join us. The noticed increase of construction of new residences (including the New Oakridge Park) reveals that this trend will continue.

The building of our new Parish Centre is necessary in order to meet our present and future needs. It will provide so many opportunities for parishioners to gather and celebrate and deepen our faith.

We need a place to provide Funeral and Sacramental receptions, opportunities for retreats and recollections, regular gatherings after Sunday Mass, as well as other special annual events. Ongoing are the need to hold Catechism classes, as well as new Catholics, youth, young adults and seniors to gather.

Our Cartier Hall is up for sale for the optimum price. We still need more funds in order to move ahead with Construction. I would say, more than ever, your support is needed at this time. Without it, it would be difficult to secure a mortgage for the rest of the Construction cost.
